
Important Information Concerning PAHS Yearbook Portraits

The Class of 2010 is about to embark on their final year of high school, and it promises to be an exciting time. One of the first responsibilities of senior year is having portraits created for the yearbook and for friends and family. It is the policy of PAHS that all the seniors be photographed by the same photographer for publication in the yearbook, and yearbook deadlines mandate that this be done in the summer months. We are pleased to have been selected this year as Senior Portrait Photographer for PAHS and are looking forward to meeting your "Senior".

While it is necessary for our studio to photograph 2010 seniors for the yearbook, there is no charge for this service and you do have a choice. Your senior can have the **yearbook only** portraits **taken at the high school** (from which you can purchase packages of the poses you like) and go to a studio of your choice for your personal portraits. Or you can **make an appointment at our studio** to have both the yearbook as well as other portraits created at the same time. We hope you will choose our studio.

We are meeting with the class of 2010 in the auditorium on Wednesday, May 20th during the activity period to explain the two options, answer any questions, and ask students to choose the one they prefer. You are welcome to attend this assembly too.

Please take a few minutes to review these options and discuss this choice with your senior so he/she is prepared to choose. Feel free to call us if you have any questions as we will be happy to answer them for you.

Because your son/daughter is a member of the PAHS Class of 2010, you have one of the following two options:

Option #1: A Complete Senior Session At Our Studio – STUDIO PRICING APPLIES

Most of today's High School Seniors like something a bit more contemporary in addition to the traditional yearbook portrait. Often they will personalize portraits with their own props such as sports equipment, cars, and/or pets. Sometimes they wish to be photographed outdoors or inside on one of our many backgrounds. Unfortunately, we are unable to do this style of photography at the high school.

For students wanting this style of photography, we can schedule a session at our studio anytime during the summer months eliminating the need for a separate trip to the high school. This **session will include the 4 to 5 yearbook poses at no extra charge** along with additional poses using several clothing/prop changes and various portrait styles.

If you choose this option, you must call the studio **by June 19th** to schedule your session at the studio. Otherwise, your son/daughter will automatically be scheduled for a session at the high school.

All studio sessions must be completed by August 30th to meet yearbook deadlines. Good appointment times will go fast.



Option #2: Yearbook Session At The High School – FREE OF CHARGE

Your son/daughter may elect to be photographed at the high school only. A Yearbook Session consisting of 4 to 5 head and shoulder poses on a traditional background will be offered. Appropriate yearbook dress is required. You will be notified by mail of the date, time, and place of your senior's appointment. Sessions will be scheduled for **July 14th, 15th, and 16th**. If you know in advance that you will be unavailable on these dates, it is your responsibility to call the studio to make other arrangements. A makeup date will be scheduled after school starts in the fall for all seniors who miss a scheduled appointment.

At the conclusion of this session, seniors will receive "proofs" and ordering information. You will then make a pose selection and return the proofs to our studio by the specified date to ensure meeting all yearbook deadlines. Proofs will not be available from the fall make-up session. The yearbook pose will be selected by your senior before leaving the session that day.
